

Trinity Mathematical Society Standing Orders

1. Meetings shall be declared social by the dropping of an apple.
2. The Society tie, if it exists, shall be “Azure, a ripe apple (with stalk and leaf) proper, within a triangle or”.
3. Other than on the Society tie, the logo of the Society shall be the (unique) smallest simple squared square, with the largest partitioning square in the top left corner and the largest of the squares adjacent to this to its right (rather than below it) (see Appendix for picture).
4. The meetings of the Society shall be numbered consecutively, including the Annual Dinner but not the Annual Cricket Match. If two meetings be held on the same day they shall receive the same number.
5. There shall exist a reciprocal arrangement between the Society and the Adams Society. Each society shall admit members of the other society to its meetings.
6. The Society shall allow the Registrar of the Archimedean to receive applications for Membership of the Society, and subscriptions. The name of any person joining under this arrangement shall not be entered into the Membership Book until the subscription is received from the Archimedean.
7. The President shall be responsible for the running of the Society, and in particular for the arrangement of meetings.
8. The Vice-President shall ensure that rooms are booked for meetings, and shall provide for meetings such equipment as may be required by the speaker.
9. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings, and shall be responsible for publicising meetings.
10. The fourth Committee member shall be called the Junior Treasurer. They shall collect subscriptions, manage the financial affairs of the Society and present a financial account to the Society at the meeting for the election of Officers.
11. The fifth Committee member shall be called the Constable. They shall assist the other members of the Committee in the execution of their duties as the need arises.
12. The sixth member of the society shall be called the Membership Secretary. They shall be responsible for processing new membership applications of the society, including the recording of new members in the membership book and the creation of membership cards.
13. The archives of the Society shall be deposited in the same place as the archives of Trinity College. Should the Archivist of the Archimedean be a Member of the Society, they shall be given access to the archives of the Society.
